Suggested Icebreakers

le Ask attendees to share reflections from their activities from last week!

🧠 vs ♥♥ Ask: Who is a head person and who is a heart person?

Takeaway after discussing: Although bhakti is an affair of the heart and we are doing everything to awaken the heartfelt relationship with God, in our stage we may need to also exercise our head in spirituality by: knowledge, hearing information, analysing things, etc.. as all of these will ultimately allow us to open our hearts lovingly to receive God. Hence a head is required and is still important! But nobody says 'I love you with all of my head', we say 'i love you with all of my heart'. This is a good segue into the content around Chapter 7 :)




